B. THE VALIDITY OF THIS PERMIT IS ALSO CONDITIONED UPON STRICT OBSERVANCE OF ALL APPLICABLE FOREIGN, STATE, LOCAL OR OTHER FEDERAL LAW.

C. VALID FOR USE BY PERMITTEE NAMED ABOVE.

D. Authorized to import and return by export migratory bird feather samples for scientific research through x-ray analysis at the Advanced Photon Source of Argonne National Laboratory in Illinois. This authorization extends neither to feathers of bald nor golden eagles, nor to the feathers of birds protected under the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species (CITES).

E. Permittee must comply with the attached Standard Conditions for Migratory Bird Import/Export.

F. Containers in which feathers are shipped must be clearly marked and accompanied by both a copy of this permit and a completed Form 3-177, "Declaration for Importation or Exportation of Fish and Wildlife."

Standard Conditions Migratory Bird Import/Export 50 CFR 21.21

All of the provisions and conditions of the governing regulations at 50 CFR Parts 13 and 14, and 50 CFR 21.21 are conditions of your permit. The standard conditions below are additional provisions and conditions of your permit. Failure to comply with the conditions of your permit could be cause for suspension of the permit. 1. This authorization does not include bald or golden eagles, threatened or endangered species, or CITES (Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna or Flora) species.
2. Authorization granted herein shall not be exercised contrary to the laws of the appropriate state, county, municipal, tribal, or foreign government or any other applicable laws.
3. You must maintain records as required in 50 CFR 13.46 and 50 CFR 14.62 (c) or (d).
4. You must keep all records relating to permitted activities at the location identified in writing by you to the issuing office.
5. Records must include as appropriate: (a) the date of shipment, (b) port of entry/exit, (c) method of shipment, (d) country of origin, and (e) the scientific and common name and number of each species of migratory bird shipped.
6. Acceptance of this permit authorizes inspection in accordance with 50 CFR 13.47.
7. Shipment of live migratory birds must comply with Humane Transport Standards as listed in 50 CFR 14, Subpart J.
8. The container in which the migratory birds are shipped must be plainly marked, giving the names and addresses of the shipper and consignee with an accurate description of the contents, including common and scientific name and quantity of each species of migratory bird being shipped.
9. A copy of this permit must be attached to the Form 3-177 (Declaration for Importation or Exportation of Fish and Wildlife) and submitted to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service/U.S. Customs upon entry/exit.
